Joint meetings with the Model Shipwrights of Niagara

During this year we will be looking at the possibility of combining our Zoom meetings with those of the Model Shipwrights of Niagara (MSON). Accordingly, the January meeting will be hosted by MSON and the February by SMS. **Both these meetings will be at 1830 London on the 2nd Sunday of the month.** For the remainder of the year until September both clubs will run their own meetings with **MSON's being on the 2nd Sunday of each month and SMS's being on the 4th Sunday, both meetings starting at 1830 London.**

MSON take a break in July and August. A decision will be made earlier in the year as to whether we will proceed with joint sessions and if the answer is yes then they will start in September. **Hence the SMS programme below runs only until the end of July before we take our break in August.**

For formal presentations, the best and simplest way of managing your contribution is to write a text, chose some images to illustrate it, then annotate your text with images/slide numbers and send the text and slides to John Garnish. Some of you may wish to run your own slide show using the “Share screen” facility but should anything go wrong with your computer we apply a rule that you must still pass a PPTX or individual slides to John so that he can bring up the slides as you speak or by using the slide number in your text. The text is a great help to myself and Mike Heath, our webmaster when we edit the video recordings of the formal presentations and to Tony Boswell when he writes up the report for the Log.

Please remember when taking photographs of models to place them in front of a suitable background. For informal discussions about models in build, all members will be encouraged to “unmute” themselves, so that they can ask spontaneous questions as the discussion progresses.. **Part completed models are often of more interest to us than the completed object.** Such discussions I

have catalogued as “**On the Stocks (OTS)**”. It therefore follows that if you are speaking OTS then you should use a few notes written in large letters rather than a formal script. **Your notes are useful for John and myself as they help with the management of slides and the editing of the videos. These sessions should be planned to take 15 – 20 minutes.**
